1.0 Background and Activity/Program Description

1.1. Purpose and Scope of IEE

The purpose of this Amendment No. 3 of the Asia 10-03 Pakistan IEE – ETD is to duly reflect on the:

1. Extension of the activity LOF until September 2019
2. To change the name of the umbrella Pakistan Integrated Primary Health Care program to Integrated Health Program.
3. The information in IEE, Amendment 1, page 1 paragraph 1.1 requires amending to delete the wording that "all programs under health will be responsive to the flood recovery needs of the country", which is not the case. All programs under health have wider national scope and are responsive to a broader spectrum of health sector needs of the country.

1.2. The replacement paragraph is:

Pakistan faces huge health challenges. USAID works closely with Pakistan's Planning & Development Division, its Population Wing, Provincial Health and Population Welfare departments, the Federally-Administered Tribal Areas (FATA) Secretariat, the private sector, and other donors to meet the challenges and improve the health status of Pakistanis. Overall goals are to help Pakistan (including the FATA & KP) meet family planning needs, boost maternal and child health and improve survival rates; improve healthy behaviors through behavior change and communication efforts; and strengthen the health systems vital sustaining improvements in the sector. To reach these goals, in addition to the ongoing activities, USAID/Pakistan is in the process of designing a new national level program, Integrated Health Program. All programs under health have a wide scope and are responsive to broader health sector needs nationally.




2.0 The scope of work and nature of activities established under the original IEE as well as all Conditions established in the original IEE for continuing activities remain the same and in force.
